

Introduction

The *Saskatchewan Executive and Legislative Directory* is maintained by Reference and Outreach Services of the Provincial Archives of Saskatchewan. The Cabinet Secretariat provides invaluable assistance with Orders-in-Council.

In 1954, to provide a convenient and authoritative historical record of the names of persons active in provincial public life, the Archives compiled and published the *Directory of Saskatchewan Ministries, Members of the Legislative Assembly, and Elections, 1905-1953*. This publication was revised in 1971 and published as the *Saskatchewan Executive and Legislative Directory, 1905-1970*. A supplement was published in 1978.

The *Directory of Members of Parliament and Federal Elections for the North-West Territories and Saskatchewan 1887-1953* was published in 1956. This provided an authoritative record of persons who represented the North-West Territories and Saskatchewan as federal members of the Senate and/or the House of Commons. All persons who were Federal and Imperial Privy Council appointments and/or federal election candidates were also listed. The first edition covered the period from 1887, when the Territories first elected members to the House of Commons, up to and including the general election of 1953. A revised edition, published in 1967, extended the coverage to the end of 1966.

The *Directory of the Council & Legislative Assembly of the North-West Territories 1876-1905* was published in 1970. This was a convenient and reliable record of those individuals who played a prominent role in public life during the Territorial period. This directory also included election results for the Territorial elections.

In 1985 it was decided to combine all three directories into one publication that would incorporate all of the data included in the earlier directories. The print version was substantially revised in 1986 and again in 1995. In 2001, this directory was revised, converted to PDF and added to the Provincial Archives of Saskatchewan website. This electronic version continues to be updated and party affiliation changes began to be tracked in 2016. Starting in 2018, the directory began tracking expanded ministerial responsibilities, such as Crown corporations, as well as additional Officers of the Legislature. Historical information for these offices has been retroactively added to 1972.

All sources used in the preparation of the previous editions have been consulted. These include: Orders-in-Council, records of the Legislative Assembly including condolence motions, *Journals of the Legislative Assembly*, electoral office records, contemporary newspapers, *Journals of the North-West Council and Territorial Legislative Assembly*, the *Saskatchewan Gazette*, the *North-West Territories Gazette*, vertical files and newspaper clipping files of the Saskatchewan Legislative Library, the Saskatchewan Newspaper Index and the Saskatoon Newspaper Index. Published sources consulted include the *Canadian Parliamentary Guide*, *The Canadian Directory of Parliament 1867-1967*, *Canadian Parliamentary Companion*, *The Canadian Annual Review*, *Provincial Elections in Saskatchewan 1905-1983*, general election reports of the Saskatchewan Chief Electoral Officer and general election reports by the Chief Electoral Officer of Canada. These sources have been supplemented by new electronic sources provided by various government offices including the Cabinet Secretariat office, the Saskatchewan Legislative Assembly <http://www.legassembly.sk.ca/>, Elections Saskatchewan <http://www.elections.sk.ca/>, and the Queen's Printer <http://www.qp.gov.sk.ca/>.
