From June 24, 1977 E.C. Malone and R.L. Collver were paid equal allowances as Leader of the Liberal Opposition and Progressive Conservative Opposition respectively.

Mr. Richard James Swenson was designated Leader of the Opposition on January 1, 1993.

Ms. Lynda Haverstock resigned as Leader of the Opposition on November 12, 1995. Mr. Ron Osika was designated Leader of the Opposition on November 15, 1995.

Mr. Kenneth Krawetz was designated Leader of the Opposition on December 6, 1996.
